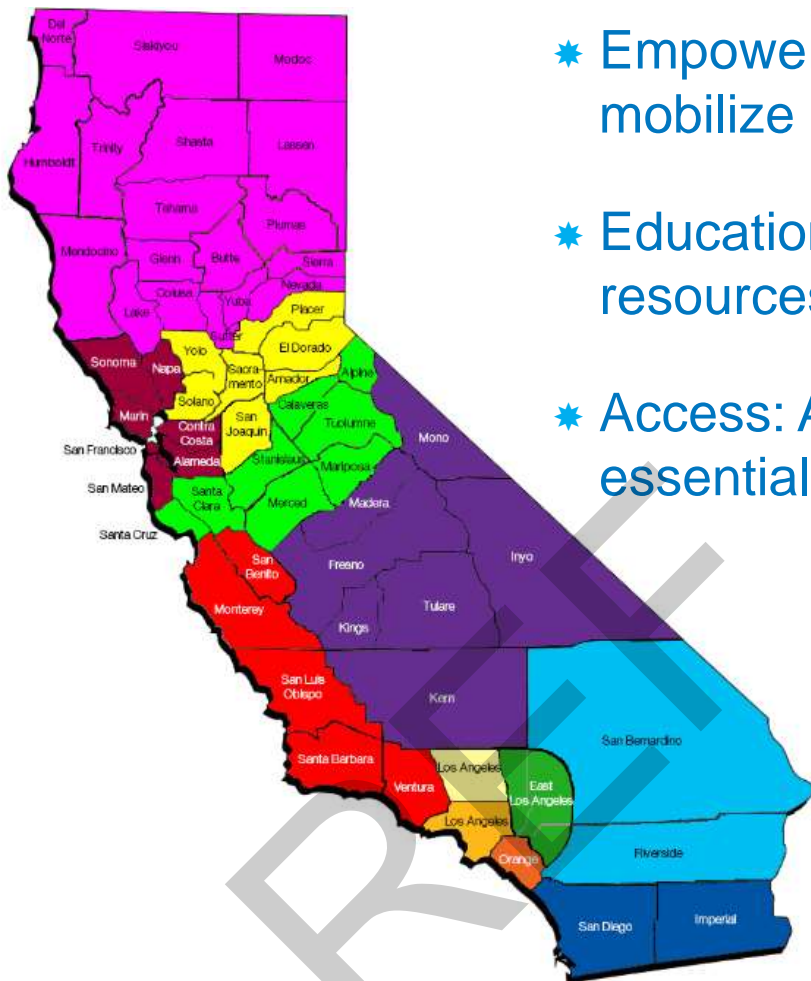

Collaboration Overview

- Where we see each other
 - School Wellness Policy Committee Meetings
 - CNAP Meetings
- How we first engaged with each other
 - Scheduled meetings aside from the SWP and CNAP meetings
 - In the initial meeting, UC CalFresh shared that DCC is on the approved curriculum list for UC CalFresh & we came up with a list of goals that we wanted to achieve collaboratively
 - One goal was to connect with the MJUSD Food Service Director (FSD) to establish a districtwide SWP committee



MJUSD, DCC and UC CalFresh Meeting

- During 1st meeting with the MJUSD FSD we discovered that she was also wanting to get the SWP committee re-established.
 - We all had a common goal!
- MJUSD received the Fresh Fruit and Veggie Grant for 7 schools & needed to provide those schools with nutrition education & decided to order DCC through the Dairy Council CNA.
- Together UC CalFresh, DCC and MJUSD established monthly themes.
 - DCC provided curriculum
 - UC CalFresh supported the curriculum by generating Monthly Newsletters to distribute to teachers
- Monthly themes were also integrated into all MJUSD's cafeterias



Collaboration Overview

- Dairy Council helped UC CalFresh meet a need in the community with nutrition education in the classroom
- UC CalFresh connected Dairy Council into the schools
 - Dairy Council curriculum meets common core standards, is user-friendly with student workbooks and teacher guides, and is conveniently shipped to schools
 - UC CalFresh provided lesson demonstrations to teachers
 - UC CalFresh was excited to learn that we would be able to connect schools that don't qualify for SNAP-Ed services to nutrition education curriculum because of our partnership with our local Dairy Council CNAs

Training and Technical Assistance

- UC CalFresh and Dairy Council collaborated to conduct district wide teacher trainings in the Marysville Joint Unified School District.
- Trainings offered professional development opportunities for teachers on the following topics.
 - Nutrition
 - Teaching Nutrition
 - Implementing DCC + UCCE curriculum.
- UC CalFresh and Dairy Council also collaborated with MJUSD to establish and implement a district wide SLM intervention and conduct trainings with Food Service Staff using *No Time to Train* Lessons.



Comprehensive Programming

UC CalFresh, Dairy Council, and the Marysville Joint Unified School District Food Service staff collaborated for comprehensive programing utilizing the following resources:

- Smarter Lunch Movement Scorecards
- SLM- No Time To Train Lesson Manual
- Pre-intervention Plate-Waste Data
 - Post-intervention Plate-Waste Data to be collected in 2019
- Dairy Council - Mobile Dairy Classroom visit
- Dairy Council Curricula - nutrition education in classrooms
- UC CalFresh - training and technical assistance and monthly food tastings



Delivery Method

- Paired classroom TTs/guest lessons with DCC curriculum
- Implement 1st lesson for teachers then provide curriculum for teacher
- Classrooms are encouraged to work on the DC workbooks at their own pace
 - supported by UC CalFresh Staff with recurring monthly check-ins for training and technical assistance



No Prep Teacher Education Kits

- UC CalFresh staff received Professional Development on DCC curricula and other nutrition resources.
 - Increased understanding of DCC for training/technical assistance with extenders
- UC CalFresh in the Butte Cluster built DCC curricula into No-Prep Teacher Education Kits (NPTEKs) designed for teachers to implement the curriculum as extenders.



Highlighting DCC Topics

- UC CalFresh develops monthly newsletters for teachers + includes tips on using DCC resources in addition to other nut/PA related suggestions.
- Each Month UC CalFresh highlights a topic and connects it to the Dairy Council Curriculum
- Monthly tastings and additional resources help to enhance specific topics within the DCC Curriculum



Upcoming UC CalFresh & DCC Activities

- No-Prep Teacher Education Kits using DCC curricula.
- SLM Tray Waste Project at Johnson Park Elementary.
- Project aimed at increasing the awareness of the MJUSD School Wellness Policy.

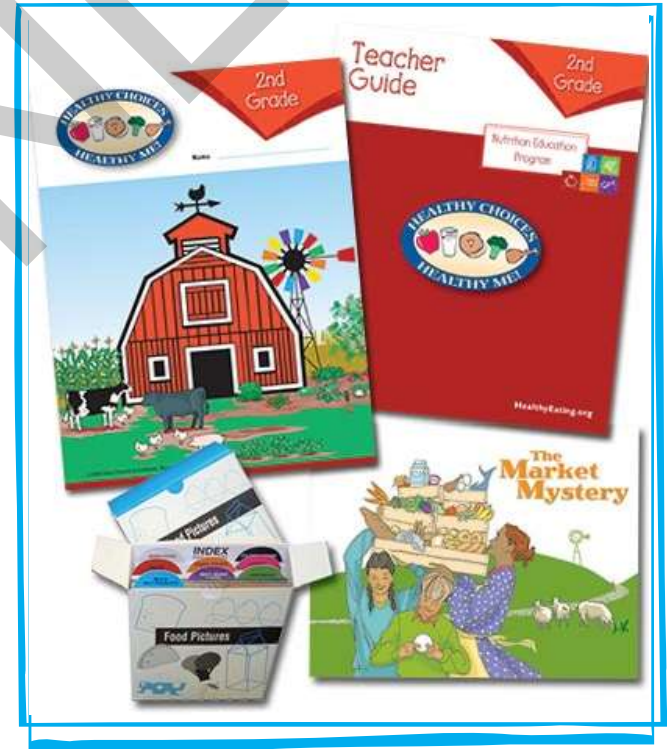

Federal Fiscal Close Deadlines FFY 2017-2018

To ensure that all appropriate expenditures are posted to the **September 2018** general ledger, please:

- ✦ Initiate purchases for low value purchase orders made without a P-card by **Wednesday, 9/12/18.**
- ✦ Initiate purchases using a P-card by **Wednesday, 9/19/18.**
- ✦ Submit approved invoices for POs & transaction detail documents for P-cards to be received in the BOC by **Tuesday, 9/25/18.**
- ✦ Submit travel expense reports in AggieTravel as soon as possible during September, but no later than **Tuesday, 9/25/18.**


